Zip Code - We need your help. Now.

For years the residents of Meadows Place have used a Stafford mailing address and never understood why we were refused a Post Office of our own. It was ...bothersome. For most it was just a matter of, "just going along." But times have changed. The expanded use of technology is causing more and more problems as ties to the postal zones and the use of self populating software programs increase. These are the ones that ask for your address and the Zip Code. Then, when you give the Zip, it automatically puts in Stafford. This process causes problems marketing our city, listing our homes and business and now may be causing us to lose out on sales tax revenues by listing Stafford as the City of Record for online and credit card sales. We realize this technological bypass is only going to get worse so the City has been seeking a solution to this problem for over a year. This is a very complex situation but has a simple solution. That solution is for Meadows Place to have its own Zip Code. To get that Zip, we have been working with the United States Postal Service, Senator Hutchison, Senator Cornyn and Congressman Pete Olson. They have all been helpful and the Post Office is officially evaluating our request! I am meeting with the USPS Regional Representative to provide maps and answer questions as part of the evaluation process. I will continue to ask our elected officials to support our position with the Post Office, but to help our cause we all have to get involved. We have worked hard to get to this point but only have until September 17th to make a difference. Please, help us secure a Zip Code for Meadows Place by contacting the following people by phone, e-mail and letter and ask them to contact the Post Office on our behalf. To send an e-mail, one option is to go to the Links section on our website. Leaving a message with a staffer is just fine. The message is simple - "It is time for Meadows Place to have a Zip Code, please help".

I was just responding to citizens who feel it is a waste of money having to pay someone to pick up cigarette butts - a position that as a taxpayer, I happen to agree with. Road Improvement Projects Delayed

Meadows Place had two projects approved as part of the 2007 Fort Bend Mobility Bond Project - the reconstruction of West Airport Blvd. from just west of Kirkwood down to the freeway intersection and the reconstruction of Kirkwood the length of the City. We needed to do the Airport portion first and our engineering firm, HDR Claunch and Miller, have completed over 90% of the engineering on this project. We had planned to bid the construction this fall. Unfortunately, Houston just started a 400 day project on West Bellfort that is having a major impact on traffic. Rick Staigle, President of Traffic Engineers, Inc., contacted the Houston engineers, projected possible alternate traffic patterns with both Airport and Bellfort impacted and determined that it would be wise for us to postpone our project for now. After much discussion, it was decided that we should delay the start of the project to avoid having traffic funnel through our city trying to get to the freeway. We will finish the engineering, monitor the situation and restart the process when it will have the least impact on our city - and we will keep you posted.

“LeadsOnline Reportit”

The Meadows Place Police Department wants to help citizens keep track of important information that will help track down stolen property faster. We are encouraging all Meadows Place residents to use a free online system that helps keep track of valuable personal property. The **Reportit** system is an online service that allows people to record serial numbers and/or upload images of cell phones, computer equipment, electronics, jewelry, and other valuables they own. Should any of those items ever be stolen, this recorded information will go a long way in helping police identify the property.

The **Reportit** service is part of **LeadsOnline**, the online system used by police across the country to track and recover stolen property. The Meadows Place Police Department uses LeadsOnline to help track and recover everything from jewelry to sporting equipment to electronics, computers, cameras, power tools, and other items such as collectibles, designer clothing, and other items of value to the owner. The system allows police to search for the items using a variety of parameters, including item descriptions and serial numbers. When an item is sold to a pawn or secondhand shop, the product information is entered into the LeadsOnline database and is immediately viewable by participating law enforcement agencies across the country.

The Meadows Place Police Department has used LeadsOnline for several years now and has had many successes using the system. Stolen property has been identified and recovered in numerous cases for Meadows Place residents. With information provided by LeadsOnline, police track down thieves, develop leads, and make arrests. Since the Meadows Place PD is a subscriber to this system, the **Reportit** service is free to our residents.

Meadows Place residents can store an unlimited number of item descriptions, serial numbers, photos, and scans of product purchase receipts – so those items may be more readily identified in the event they are stolen. This record may also come in handy when filing insurance claims. Residents wanting to participate in **Reportit** can register for the free service at <http://reportit.leadsonline.com> and begin building their personal property inventory list. Where Will You or Your Family Be When a Disaster Strikes?

You could be anywhere – at work, at school or in the car. How will you find each other? Will you know if your children are safe? Emergencies and disasters can strike quickly and without warning and can force you to evacuate your neighborhood or confine you to your home. What would you do if basic services — water, gas, electricity or telephone — were cut off? Local officials and relief workers will be on the scene after a disaster, but they cannot reach everyone right away. You can cope with disaster by preparing in advance and by working with your family as a team. Follow the steps listed to be prepared. 1. Get informed 2. Make a plan 3. Assemble a kit 4. Maintain your plan and kit. Knowing what to do is your best protection and your responsibility. In this month's newsletter we will discuss steps 1 and 2, next month we will discuss steps 3 and 4. In this month's newsletter we will discuss our Steps to Preparedness

1. GET INFORMED Contact your local emergency management office or local American Red Cross Chapter to gather the information you will need to create a plan. Ask about the specific hazards that threaten your community (e.g. hurricanes, tornados, and earthquakes) and about your risk from those hazards. Additionally, hazard information for your local area can be obtained at. Learn about community response plans, evacuation plans, and designated emergency shelters. Ask about the emergency plans and procedures that exist in places you and your family spend time such as places of employment, schools, and child care centers. If you do not own a vehicle or drive, find out in advance what your community's plans are for evacuating those without private transportation. Systems Find out how local authorities will warn you of a pending disaster and how they will provide information to you during and after a disaster. Learn about NOAA Weather Radio and its alerting capabilities (www.noaa.gov).

2. MAKE A PLAN

• **Meet with Your Family Members.** Review the information you gathered about community hazards and plans. Explain the dangers to children and work with them as a team to prepare your family. Be sure to include caregivers in your meeting and planning efforts.

• **Choose an "Out-of-Town" Contact.** Ask an out-of-town friend or relative to be your contact. Following a disaster, family members should call this person and tell them where they are. Everyone must know the contact's phone numbers. After a disaster, it is often easier to make a long distance call than a local call from a disaster area.

• **Decide Where to Meet.** In the event of an emergency, you may become separated from family members. Choose a place right outside your home in case of a sudden emergency, like a fire. Choose a location outside your neighborhood in case you can't return home.

• **Complete a Family Communication Plan.** Your plan should include contact information for family members, work and school. Your plan should also include information for your out-of-town contact, meeting locations, emergency services and the National Poison Control Center (1-800-222-1222). A sample form for recording this information can be found at www.ready.gov - or at www.redcross.org.

These websites also provide blank wallet cards on which contact information can be recorded and carried in a wallet, purse, backpack, etc., for quick reference. Teach your children how to call the emergency phone numbers and when it is appropriate to do so. Be sure each family member has a copy of your communication plan and post it near your telephone for use in an emergency.

• **Escape Routes and Safe Places.** In a fire or other emergency, you may need to evacuate on a moment's notice. Be ready to get out fast. Be sure everyone in your family knows the best escape routes out of your home as well as where the safe places are in your home for each type of disaster (i.e., if a tornado approaches, go to the basement or the lowest floor of your home or an interior room or closet with no windows). Use a blank sheet of paper to draw floor plans of your home. Show the location of doors, windows, stairways, large furniture, your disaster supplies kit, fire extinguisher, smoke alarms, collapsible ladders, first-aid kits, and utility shut-off points. Show important points outside such as garages, patios, stairways, elevators, driveways, and porches. See illustration below. Indicate at least two escape routes from each room, and mark a place outside of the home where household members should meet in case of fire. If you or someone in your household uses a wheelchair, make all exits from your home wheelchair accessible. Practice emergency evacuation drills at least two times a year, but as often as you update your escape plan.

• **Plan for those with disabilities and other special needs.** Keep support items in a designated place, so they can be found quickly. For those who have home-health caregivers, particularly for those who are bed-bound, it is essential to have an alternate plan if the home-health caregiver cannot make it to you. In advance, provide the power company with a list of all power-dependent life support equipment required by family members. Develop a contingency plan that includes an alternate power source for the equipment or relocating the person.

• **Plan for your pets.** Take your pets with you if you evacuate. However, be aware that pets (other than service animals) usually are not permitted in emergency public shelters for health reasons. Prepare a list of family, friends, boarding facilities, veterinarians, and "pet-friendly" hotels that could shelter your pets in an emergency.

• **Prepare for different hazards.** Include in your plan how to prepare for each hazard that could impact your local community and how to protect yourself. For instance, the actions you would take to protect yourself from a tornado are different from those you would for a fire. Reference the websites listed on the back cover to learn more about the different actions required for different hazards.

• **Utilities.** Know how and when to turn off water, gas and electricity at the main switches or valves and share this information with your family and caregivers. Keep any tools you will need near gas and water shut off valves. Turn off the utilities only if you suspect the lines are damaged, you suspect a leak or if local officials instruct you to do so. (Note: Gas shut-off procedure - As part of the learning process, do not actually turn off the gas. If the gas is turned off for any reason, only a qualified professional can turn it back on. It might take several weeks for a professional to respond. In the meantime, you will require alternate sources to heat your home, make hot water, and cook.)



Public Works (continued)

• Fire Extinguisher

Be sure everyone knows how to use your fire extinguishers (ABC type) and where they are kept.

• Smoke Alarms

Install smoke alarms on each level of your home, especially near the bedrooms. Individuals with sensory disabilities should consider installing smoke alarms that have strobe lights and vibrating pads. Follow local codes and manufacturer's instructions about installation requirements. Also, consider installing a carbon monoxide alarm in your home.

• Insurance Coverage

Check if you have adequate insurance coverage. Homeowners insurance does not cover flood damage and may not provide full coverage for other hazards. Talk with your insurance agent and make sure you have adequate coverage to protect your family against financial loss.

• First Aid/CPR & AED (Automated External Defibrillation)

Take American Red Cross first aid and CPR/AED classes. Red Cross courses can accommodate people with disabilities. Discuss your needs when registering for the classes.

• Inventory Home Possessions

Make a record of your possessions to help you claim reimbursement in case of loss or damage. Store this information in a safe deposit box or other secure (flood/fire safe) location to ensure the records survive a disaster. Include photographs or video of the interior and exterior of your home as well as cars, boats and recreational vehicles. Also, have photos of durable medical equipment and be sure to make a record of the make and model numbers for each item. Get professional appraisals of jewelry, collectibles, artwork, or other items that may be difficult to evaluate. Make copies of receipts and canceled checks showing the cost for valuable items.

• Vital Records and Documents

Vital family records and other important documents such as birth and marriage certificates, social security cards, passports, wills, deeds, and financial, insurance, and immunizations records should be kept in a safe deposit box or other safe location.

• Reduce Home Hazards

- In a disaster, ordinary items in the home can cause injury and damage. Take these steps to reduce your risk.
- Have a professional repair defective electrical wiring and leaky gas connections.
- Place large, heavy objects on lower shelves and hang pictures and mirrors away from beds.
- Use straps or other restraints to secure tall cabinets, bookshelves, large appliances (especially water heater, furnace, and refrigerator), mirrors, shelves, large picture frames, and light fixtures to wall studs.
- Repair cracks in ceilings and foundations.
- Store weed killers, pesticides, and flammable products away from heat sources.
- Place oily rags or waste in covered metal cans and dispose of them according to local regulations.
- Have a professional clean and repair chimneys, flue pipes, connectors, and gas vents.



Have a Good Looking Yard, While Conserving Water?

Drought conditions are widespread across the state, and while we all would like to see a thriving green lawn, how do we achieve it and conserve water at the same time? Our beautiful city has lush green grass surrounding our new lake through the use of water reclamation, but how can you achieve the same result and still conserve a precious natural resource?

Here are some conservation friendly ideas for yard care:

- Plant drought –resistant shrubs & plants, and group them together according to their watering needs
- Put a layer of mulch around trees and plants to slow evaporation and preserve moisture
- Water your lawn only when it needs it... most lawns only need about 1” of water each week. You can “test” your lawn to see if it needs watering by walking on it. If it lays flat after you’ve walked on it, then it is time to water
- Water your yard before 10 am, and avoid watering if it is windy to avoid evaporation
- To measure the amount of water applied, you can simply place an empty 6oz tuna can on your lawn. It’s time to stop watering when the can is full.
- Monitor your sprinkling system to ensure that you are not producing run-off and that you are not watering paved areas
- Consider a rain catch system. A 1,000 sq ft roof can produce 600 gallons of rainwater during a 1” rainfall
- If you have an irrigation system, be sure to have it serviced annually so that it makes the most out of watering your lawn

Another issue is that some people believe that if they don’t water their lawn it will keep the grass from growing and then they won’t need to mow or edge/weedeat... On the contrary; the quickest growing substance in a yard will be a weed. Most weeds are drought resistant, thus you will need to continue to mow & weedeat your fast growing weeds more often than if you maintain your grass properly. A deep, well-rooted lawn will use water efficiently and will prevent weeds from thriving.

Pool & Tennis Court Access System

Pool and Tennis Court Access System

The City of Meadows Place has an access system for the pool and tennis court facilities. All pool and tennis access cards will be deleted the second weekend of May.

Tennis court access cards can be purchased for \$50.00 per card (maximum 2 cards per family), and **MUST** be re-purchased the second weekend of May each year. A driver's license and/or water bill must be shown to purchase the access card. Cards can be purchased at City Hall, Monday through Friday, 9:00 a.m.-4:00 p.m.

A wristband system is used at the pool. **Residents MUST re-purchase new wristbands by the second weekend in May each year.** A four pack of wristbands can be purchased for \$10, and additional wristbands can be purchased for \$5 each. Every resident must show their wristband to the concessions staff as they enter the pool gates. Each resident wearing a wristband is allowed to bring one guest. The guests must get a hand stamp upon entering the gates. The wristbands can be purchased at the concession window at the pool during operating hours. A driver's license and/or water bill **MUST** be shown by residents to purchase wristbands. One day pass wristbands can be purchased for \$5 each.






